## **SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING STATEMENT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2026-27**

### **Company Statement**

Persistent Systems Ltd. and all its subsidiaries and affiliates (“Company”) is committed to the highest standards of ethical behavior integrity in everything we do and contributing to the wellbeing of communities around the world. The Company has set out the steps and continuously ensures that modern slavery and human trafficking does not take place within its business or supply chain.

### **Our Organization Structure, Business and Supply Chains**

### **Our Policies on Slavery and Human Trafficking**

The Company has a zero-tolerance approach to all human rights abuses. We have in place various policies that outline our commitment to the identification and prevention of modern slavery in our business. These include:

We are committed to ensuring that workers employed in our supply chains are treated fairly, humanely and equally. We require our suppliers to comply with the Vendor's/Consultant's Code of Conduct wherein, we have ensured that they shall comply with all the applicable laws including the applicable labor laws, work ethics and industry standards.

We are in business of developing software, and all our core business operations are handled by staff directly employed by us. We are not directly involved in any activities like building construction, corporate cleaning, manufacture of building materials and textiles used in property development. We recognize the above said sectors may come with modern slavery risks. Considering the Company is in the business related to core software development activities, we believe such activity does not pose any modern slavery risks.

### **Due Diligence of Supply Chains**

We have in place systems to:

- Assess potential suppliers' ability to deliver services to the required industry standards.
- Monitor performance of our supply chains to verify they are delivering services in accordance with our contract terms.
- Protect whistleblowers.

### **Key Performance Indicators**

We periodically review our policies, guidelines and procedures to assess modern slavery risks and make necessary changes to mitigate the same. To combat modern slavery and increase the effectiveness of our actions we have identified following focus areas –

- Governance & due diligence;
- Procurement & supply chain;
- HR practices, training & education;
- Grievances and reporting

Against each of these focus areas we have developed Key Performance Indicators (collectively referred to as, "KPIs") that we will use to assess the effectiveness of our actions. Our KPIs include: the percentage of precedent contracts with inclusion of modern slavery related clauses; completion rates for modern slavery related clauses; completion rates for modern slavery awareness training; and the number of modern slavery cases identified and remediated.

Over subsequent reporting periods, we will continue to review and enhance the above-mentioned KPIs and develop further metrics to assess the effectiveness of our actions, in line with continuous improvement.

## Staff Awareness and Training

Staff awareness and training is achieved through new joiners' induction program and annual awareness campaign. The statement applies to all our entities, where software development is our core business activity carried out by skilled professionals, which eradicates risk of modern slavery and human trafficking. The policies which cover slavery and human trafficking aspects, are communicated to employees of all Company. Further, staff awareness and trainings related to modern slavery are extended on an annual basis, to these employees.
